ORDER ESTABLISHING PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD ON PETITION FOR PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE RULES OF THE MINNESOTA BOARD OF CONTINUING LEGAL EDUCATION

On October 5, 2023, the Minnesota State Board of Continuing Legal Education filed a petition recommending amendments to the Rules of the Minnesota Board of Continuing Legal Education, that would require all lawyers to report at least one credit on the topic of mental health and substance use in the legal profession and in the practice of law for each reporting cycle. The petition and proposed amendments are available on the public-access site for the Minnesota Appellate Courts, under case number ADM09-8008 – Petition of the Minnesota State Board of Continuing Legal Education for Amendment of the Rules of the Minnesota State Board Continuing Legal Education (Minn. filed Oct. 5, 2023).

The court will consider the petition and proposed amendments to the Rules of the Minnesota Board of Continuing Legal Education after providing a period for public comment and reviewing any comments on the proposed amendments.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that any person or organization that wants to provide comments in support of or in opposition to the proposed amendments to the Rules of the Minnesota Board of Continuing Legal Education shall file those comments with the Clerk of the Appellate Courts, using the appellate courts' e-filing application, E-MACS, if

required to do so. *See* Minn. R. Civ. App. P. 125.01(a)(1). All comments shall be filed so as to be received by the Clerk's office no later than January 2, 2024.
